The Call to Confession

Psalm 90:7-8, 12

For we are brought to an end by your anger; by your wrath we are dismayed. ⁸You have set our iniquities before you, our secret sins in the light of your presence.

So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom.

Our Spoken Prayer of Confession:

Scripture Reading: 1 John 2:1,2

My little children, I am writing you these things so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an *advocate with the Father—Jesus Christ the Righteous One.*

Sharing the Lord's Supper

M: Beloved in the Lord Jesus, the meal which we are about to celebrate is a feast of remembrance, communion, and hope.

C: We come to remember that Jesus was sent into the world to assume our flesh and blood, to become God with us, that we might be redeemed.

As we come to the table as repentant sinners, Christ wants to assure us of his forgiveness. As we come with our struggles, Christ wants to assure us of his living presence. As we come with our doubts, Christ wants to touch us with the flesh and blood reality of his life.

And

At the Lord's Supper we look back, remembering the whole story of our salvation; we look around, seeing that we are together members of the body of Christ; we look forward to the great banquet in God's coming kingdom; and we look up to our ascended Lord, who promises to feed us with his body and blood by the Holy Spirit.

Prayers of Remembrance and Thanks

By worshippers extemporaneously

1Corinthians 11:23-26 **Bread**

²³ For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, ²⁴ and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, "This is my body, which is for you.

Cup

Do this in remembrance of me." ²⁵ In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

²⁶ For as often as WE eat this bread and drink the cup, WE proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Response: "When Peace like a River" vv. 1-3

When peace like a river attendeth my way, when sorrows like sea billows roll; whatever my lot, thou hast taught me to say, "It is well, it is well with my soul."

<u>Refrain</u> It is well with my soul; it is well, it is well with my soul.

2 Though Satan should buffet, though trials should come, let this blest assurance control: that Christ has regarded my helpless estate, and has shed his own blood for my soul. Refrain

3 My sin oh, the bliss of this glorious thought! my sin, not in part, but the whole, is nailed to the cross, and I bear it no more; praise the Lord, praise the Lord, 0 my soul!

Eternal Life – Begins now through faith in Jesus

Scripture Reading: John 6:45-51

⁴⁵ It is written in the Prophets, 'And they will all be taught by God.' Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to me— ⁴⁶ not that anyone has seen the Father except he who is from God; he has seen the Father. ⁴⁷ Truly, truly, I say to you, *whoever believes has eternal life.* ⁴⁸ I am the bread of life. ⁴⁹ Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. ⁵⁰ This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so *that one may eat of it and not die.* ⁵¹ I am the living bread that came down from *heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever.* And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God!

Through union with Christ by faith. Eternal life is current possession to be consummated at the resurrection when Jesus returns.

Catechism Response:

How does "the resurrection of the body" comfort you? Not only my soul will be taken immediately after this life to Christ its head, but even my very flesh, raised by the power of Christ, will be reunited with my soul and made like Christ's glorious body.

How does the article concerning "life everlasting" comfort you? Even as I already now experience in my heart the beginning of eternal joy, so after this life I will have perfect blessedness such as no eye has seen, no ear has heard, no man has ever imagined: a blessedness in which to praise God eternally. Scripture Reading: Matthew 7:7-12

⁷ "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. ⁸ For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. ⁹ Or which one of you, if his son asks him for bread, will give him a stone? ¹⁰ Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a serpent? ¹¹ If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him!

Help in Temptations -

Scripture Reading: Hebrews 4:14-16

Response: **A Reading of Psalm 34:1-10** Lexham English Bible Of David, when he pretended to be crazy in front of Abimelech so that he drove him out, and so he departed.

34 I will bless Yahweh at all times: his praise *shall be* in my mouth continually. ² My soul makes its boast in Yahweh; let the humble hear and be glad. ³ Magnify Yahweh with me, and let us exalt his name together. ⁴ I sought Yahweh and he answered me, and from all my terrors he delivered me. ⁵ They looked to him and were radiant, and their faces shall not be ashamed. ⁶ This poor man called and Yahweh heard, and saved him from all his troubles. ⁷ The angel of Yahweh encamps around those who fear him. and he rescues them. ⁸ Taste and see that Yahweh *is* good; blessed is the man who takes refuge in him. ⁹ Fear Yahweh, you his saints, for there is no lack for those who fear him. ¹⁰ The young lions are in want and suffer hunger, but those who seek Yahweh will not lack for any good thing.

Protection in All Things /God's Presence and Love

Scripture Reading: Romans 8:31-39

³¹ What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? ³² He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? ³³ Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. ³⁴ Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. ³⁵ Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? ³⁶ As it is written,

"For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered."

³⁷ No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸ For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹ nor

height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need. ¹³ I can do all things through him who strengthens me. The Word of the Lord.

How shall we live in relationship to others?

We will honor our parents and hold the family in high esteem; we will not abuse, hate or injure our friends or neighbors by word, gesture or deed; we will not commit adultery, but live holy disciplined lives; we will not steal; we will not lie; we will not grasp for what we do not have, nor reject others for having it.

How does Jesus summarize these commandments?

He says that we should love the Lord our God with all our heart, mind and strength, and our neighbors as ourselves, and by God's grace, we will do it!
