Call to Confess

Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you.

For thus says the One who is high and lifted up, who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy: "I dwell in the high and holy place, ^{and} also with him who is of a contrite and lowly spirit, to revive the spirit of the lowly, and to revive the heart of the contrite.

It is Christ's table to which we have been invited by grace. This means that we have been invited to rejoice in the acceptance and fellowship such an invitation entails. Responding to that invitation, let us take off our "masks" and stand revealed in the pure light of divine holiness. Unfeigned and exposed before our Lord, we examine ourselves in penitence and faith and thus eat at His table in a worthy manner. "Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup." 1 Cor.11:28 (ESV)

Words of Assurance/ The Gospel Announcement
