CONFESSION AND ASSURANCE

Call to Confession The Scriptures tell us “All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. [1 John 1:8f] Let us confess our sins, looking to Jesus Christ, our Savior, with faith and hope, knowing that he alone forgives and brings newness of life.

Please join me in the prayer of confession. Let us pray.

Prayer: Dear God, often as your children, we start every morning determined to make it through the day without sinning; but the truth is that we don't get very far. New Testament- Ephesians 2:1-10 And you were dead in the trespasses and sins ²in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience— ³among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind. ⁴But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, ⁵even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved— ⁶and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, ⁷so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. ⁸For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, ⁹not a result of works, so that no one may boast. ¹⁰For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.

New Testament- Luke 18:9-14 He also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and treated others with contempt: ¹⁰“Two men went up into the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. ¹¹The Pharisee, standing by himself, prayed thus: ‘God, I thank you that I am not like other men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. ¹²I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I get.’ ¹³But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even lift up his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, ‘God, be merciful to me, a sinner!’ ¹⁴I tell you, this man went down to his house justified, rather than the other. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted.”

COMMUNION /THE HOLY SUPPER OF OUR LORD FOR HIS DISCIPLES

This is the joyful feast of the people of God. With joy, we remember that God rescued us from sin by sending Jesus Christ into the world to become human, like us, but without sin. With gratitude, we remember that through his death and resurrection we have been set free from sin and death to share the glorious freedom as children of God. With thanksgiving, we rejoice that Jesus' resurrection enables us to live each day with God's power. May we know the risen Christ and rejoice in the unity he gives us.

LET US CONFESS THE MYSTERY OF FAITH

The Word became flesh and lived among us as one of us without sin, The Word is Jesus the Messiah. He said the Son of Man had come to give his life a ransom for many.

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ ascended, Christ will come again.

John 13:1 reads It was just before the Passover Festival. Jesus knew that the hour had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end.

As a visible symbol of his love for them, he instituted a new memorial meal marking the enactment of the New Covenant in the sacrifice of his blood. He gave them and all who believe through the witness of the Word of the gospel this precious holy meal **For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.**

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

As we are gathered about this table, let each of us offer, thanks. (**Silence**)

Gracious God our Father, you have given us these elements of bread and the fruit of the vine as a living remembrance of our Savior Jesus Christ. We are thankful that our Lord Jesus gave us this holy meal before his once for all suffering and death for our redemption. Open our hearts and minds to receive in faith this gospel ordinance, and grant that in receiving the bread and cup we may acknowledge and know the presence of Jesus by the Holy Spirit with us and be strengthened in our fellowship with one another. Amen

As they were eating he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them.

"This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.

Breaking of the Bread

Take and eat this in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your heart by faith, with thanksgiving.

The Cup

"In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Drink this in remembrance that Christ's Blood was shed for you, and be thankful. (**Silent Prayer**)

REFORMATION CONFESSION

We believe in the one eternal God, Creator and Lord of the world, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, who created all things according to the purpose of His will.

We believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the inspired Word of God and the only infallible authority for Christian life and doctrine. We believe it is the right and duty of each Christian to read, study, and obey the Scriptures. No doctrine is to be received unless it is taught in the Bible.

We believe that Jesus Christ alone is the Savior of men. He paid the sin debt that we owe by His perfect and all sufficient sacrifice on the cross. As the living Lord He is to be received by faith alone. We believe that God accepts us on the basis of Christ Jesus' person and work and not any merit of our own. We affirm justification by grace alone through faith in Christ alone.

We believe that all believers have the right to direct access to God through Jesus Christ. It is also our spiritual duty to intercede in behalf of other believers and to exercise our spiritual gifts for the upbuilding of the community of God's covenant people. We affirm the priesthood of all believers.

We, furthermore, believe that baptism (immersion) should be administered upon confession of faith in Christ Jesus, to believers only. This sacred ceremony signifies our identification in Christ's death, burial, and resurrection, and our desire to live as obedient disciples.

We believe that the true Church of the Lord should be an association of true believers in Christ who through His grace have covenanted together to live a life of commitment to Jesus Christ and for the purpose of the worship of God.
